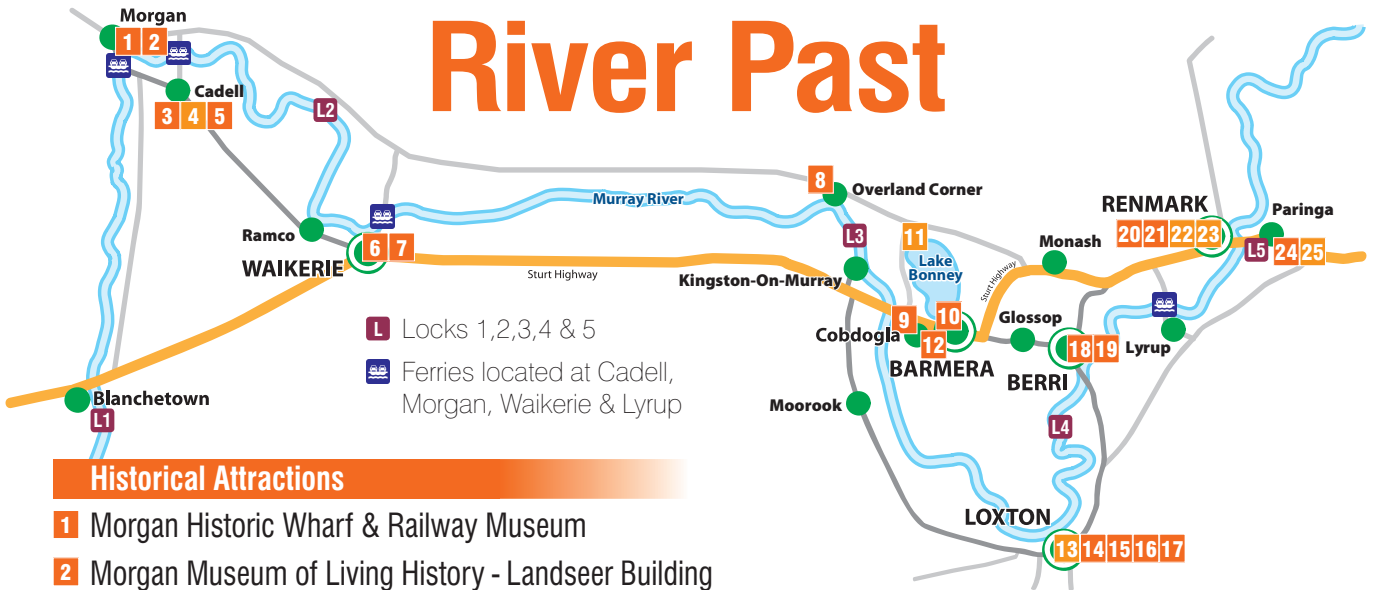





River Past

Itinerary

Start your day at the **Country Bakehouse** in Loxton and then stroll down the hill and be transformed into the past at **The Village Historic Loxton**. Or if you are coming from Adelaide start your day with a coffee (and breakfast) at the **Morgan Riverview Café**, then stroll down to the **Morgan Historic Wharf & Railway Museum**. Take a short drive out to NorWest Bend lookout and enjoy the view. Then take the Cadell Ferry to the **Cadell Interpretative Centre** featuring the early settlers and historical channel irrigation systems. **The Waikerie Hotel** is perfect for lunch before heading to the **Waikerie RSL Club & War Museum**. Take the Waikerie Ferry en route to Overland Corner and wander the Overland Corner cliffs and trails, before enjoying a local brew at the historical **Overland Corner Hotel**. Drive back via Lake Bonney and the **Nappers Bridge Ruins** through to the **Cobdogla Steam Irrigation Museum**. Finish your day with a yummy schnitzel at the **Cobdogla Club** or fish and chips from the **Bluebird Café** on the Lake Bonney foreshore.
